WHEREAS, Arizona is home to 130,000 people diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and it's projected that number will reach 200,000 by the year 2025 – an increase of 53.8 percent; and

WHEREAS, 319,000 caregivers are providing more than 364 million hours valued at nearly \$4.5 billion dollars in care to persons with Alzheimer's and related disorders; and

WHEREAS, collaborative efforts are crucial to success in providing quality care and supportive services to those impacted by Alzheimer's and other dementia related diseases; and

WHEREAS, the Arizona's Alzheimer's Task Force is sanctioned by this office to facilitate implementation of the Alzheimer's State Plan, engage new and ongoing community partners and stakeholders to both provide outreach and participate in "Calls to Action."
